Bombing threat again

For the second time, the bomb threat message received at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport has been proved to be fake. The airport authorities did not find anything threatening after searching.

Yesterday at 11 pm on Wednesday night, the airport duty officer of APBN received a threatening message from a Malaysian WhatsApp number on WhatsApp. After that, the search was carried out until half past two

Group Captain Kamrul Islam, Executive Director of Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport, told the media, "After receiving the message, security was strengthened and search was carried out in coordination with all the forces responsible at the airport as per the prescribed protocol." However, the security search was officially declared over

Earlier, a bomb threat message was sent from a Pakistani number to a Dhaka-bound Biman Bangladesh Airlines flight from Rome, Italy. The message was given on the official WhatsApp number of the duty officer of Airport APBN.

It is said in that message, "There are 34 kg of explosives on the flight from Rome to Dhaka." They will be detonated after the flight lands at Shahjalal Airport. '
