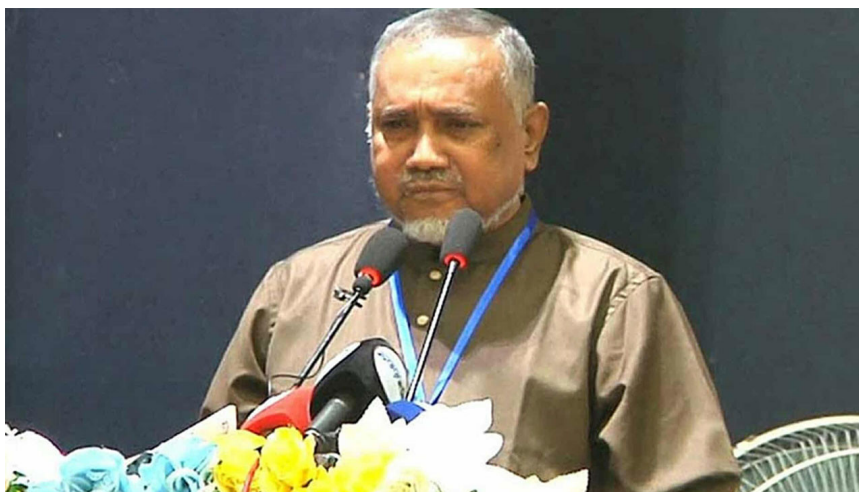




Jamaat Leader Urges Shift from ‘Delhi and Pindi’ Slogans to a Bangladesh-Centric Vision

Syed Abdullah Muhammad Taher, Nayeb-e-Ameer of Jamaat-e-Islami, has called on political forces to abandon slogans linked to Delhi and Pindi, urging instead the adoption of slogans that embody the spirit and identity of Bangladesh.

Speaking on Tuesday afternoon at a youth conference organized by Jatiya Juboshokti — the youth wing of the Jatiya Nagorik Party — at the Krishibid Institute in Dhaka, he stressed the importance of breaking free from outdated political mindsets.

“It is deeply regrettable that, even decades after our independence, we continue to echo the slogans of Delhi and Pindi,” he said. “This reflects a persistent inferiority complex. The belief that attaining power requires the blessings of foreign powers remains a barrier to true independence.”
