



Israel Unaware of Terms of Possible Iran–US Deal

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has said that Israel has not received full details regarding a potential nuclear agreement between the United States and Iran. He made the remarks during a press briefing on Monday. Netanyahu stated that even if a deal is reached, Iran must not be allowed to acquire nuclear weapons. He also claimed that recent military operations have damaged Iran's nuclear facilities, missile infrastructure, and broader military capabilities. He added that while Israel maintains close coordination with the United States, the two countries do not always share identical positions on all issues. Despite this, he stressed that Israel will continue taking necessary steps to ensure its security. Netanyahu also confirmed that Israel will maintain its military presence in areas including the Lebanon border and emphasized readiness to respond to future threats. Meanwhile, opposition leader Gadi Eisenkot criticized Netanyahu's comments, saying that despite prolonged conflict, Israel has not achieved its intended objectives. He also described Iran as a continuing major threat to Israel in the future.
