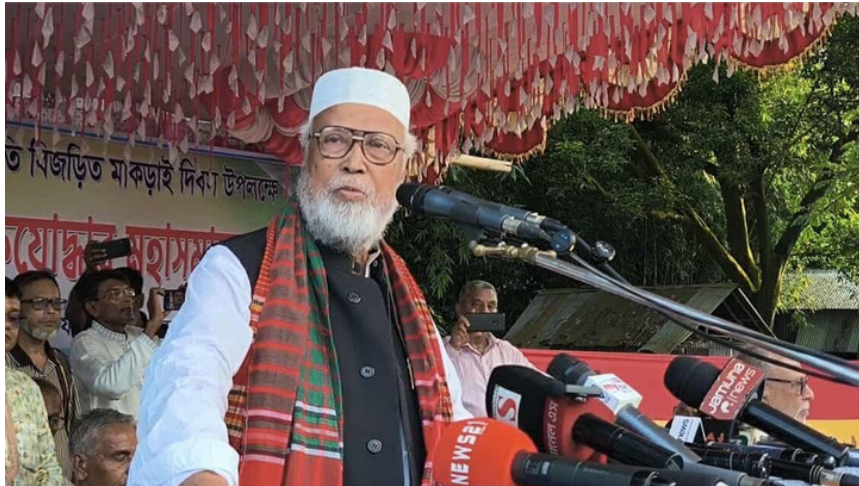




Interim Government May Face Worse Fate Than Hasina Regime Without February Election: Kader Siddiqui

Bongobir Abdul Kader Siddiqui (Bir Uttam) has warned that if the upcoming elections are not held in February, the situation under the interim government will become even worse than that of the autocratic Sheikh Hasina regime.

He made the remarks on Saturday (August 16) at 5 p.m. while addressing a gathering of freedom fighters of the Kaderia Bahini in Ghatail, marking the historic Makrai Day.

Cautioning the BNP, Siddiqui said, “Whatever happened during the 16 years of Awami League’s autocratic rule—if you repeat the same in just 16 months, the people will instantly turn their backs on you.”

The rally was organized by the Krishak Sramik Janata League and presided over by Bir Muktiyoddha Fazlur Haque (Bir Protik).

Former minister Latif Siddiqui also spoke at the gathering. He said, “Although we achieved victory through the Liberation War in 1971, we could not bring smiles to the faces of our people. In the days ahead, there will be another war in this country—this time not with weapons, but of ideology. And in that ideological war, we must prevail.”
