



Government Will Be Responsible if Decisions Violate July Ordinance: BNP

BNP has stated that if the government announces any decision beyond the limits set in the July National Ordinance, the parties that signed the ordinance will not be obliged to comply. The full responsibility for such actions will rest entirely with the government.

On Tuesday (11 November), at a press conference of the party's Standing Committee held at the BNP Chairperson's office in Gulshan, Standing Committee member Khandakar Mosharraf Hossain outlined the party's position.

Dr. Khandakar Mosharraf Hossain said that some of the government's advisors are making misleading statements, which amount to disregarding the decisions taken by the Election Commission by consensus.

At the same event, Standing Committee member Salahuddin Ahmed stated that in implementing the July National Ordinance, no orders can be issued without a presidential decree. He warned that any unilateral issuance of orders by the government would be legally invalid.

He further added, "Creating new issues outside the July Ordinance is politically unreasonable and deliberate."

Party leaders also alleged that certain groups, unable to participate in elections, are intentionally trying to create unrest and destabilize the political environment, which is a serious threat to the democratic process.
