



Iran was the one eager for talks: Trump

U.S. President Donald Trump has responded to criticism over the recent understanding with Iran, claiming that it was Tehran, not Washington, that was more interested in negotiations.

In a post on his social media platform Truth Social, Trump said the United States did not enter talks from a position of pressure or weakness. According to him, Iran took the initiative to move forward with an agreement.

He also commented on the next phase of the deal, saying efforts are underway to reach a final settlement within the 60-day timeframe outlined in the memorandum, and that Washington is following that process.

Trump added that there will be no sanctions relief or release of funds for Iran until a final agreement is reached. He further claimed that Tehran is not receiving any financial benefits at this stage.

While the new phase in Iran–U.S. relations is drawing international attention, questions remain over implementation and the future direction of the agreement.
