



Consensus Through Dissent Is Democracy's Measure: Tarique Rahman

The BNP believes that having differing opinions is natural, and achieving compromise through their expression is the core principle of a civilized democratic process. The party's acting chairman, Tarique Rahman, said, "Prioritizing party interests is not the job of any government."

He delivered a virtual speech on Saturday (November 8) at a conference organized by the Matua Bahujan Samaj Unity Alliance. He stated, "Even if there are differences of religion or community, our primary identity is being Bangladeshi. Law and order and the rule of law are the best means to ensure citizens' security."

He also warned that everyone must work together to prevent fascist forces' secret agencies from destabilizing the country. Upon coming to power, the party plans to introduce family cards for 5 million households and a special 'Farmers Card' for agricultural workers.

Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, speaking at the event, said, "BNP is working to build a secular and progressive society by leaving behind past mistakes." He urged the public to join the party in implementing key policies, including minority protection laws.
