



Iran rejects reports of deal with Washington

Iran has dismissed reports that a possible agreement with the United States has been finalized, calling them baseless. Tehran says ongoing talks have not reached a final stage and that much of the information circulating on the matter does not reflect reality.

Foreign Ministry spokesperson Esmail Baghaei said claims about progress in negotiations are premature. He added that no final decision has been made so far and that conditions for a completed agreement have not yet emerged.

According to reports by the state news agency IRNA, discussions are continuing, but several key issues remain unresolved. As a result, Tehran considers claims of a completed deal to be premature and misleading.

However, in an interview with Tasnim News Agency, Baghaei said a large part of the draft framework has already been worked out. He also accused the United States of repeatedly shifting its position during the talks, making the path to an agreement more complicated. Communication between Washington and Tehran is ongoing, but no official announcement of a final deal has been made so far.
