



Bangladesh Triumphs Over India After 22 Years

History was made on Tuesday at the National Stadium during the Asian Cup qualifiers. The packed gallery of spectators was eagerly waiting for a thrilling contest—but Bangladesh turned that contest into a priceless victory. After a long gap of 22 years, the long-cherished dream of defeating India finally came true. The team played with strong discipline, confidence, and perfect coordination, changing the course of the match within just 11 minutes.
