



BNP Wants Interim Government to Play Caretaker Role

To ensure a free and fair national election, BNP has called on Dr. Muhammad Yunus, Chief Advisor of the Interim Government, to take on a caretaker role. BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir made this demand after a meeting at the State Guest House Jamuna on Tuesday evening. He also emphasized the importance of keeping the administration free from party influence.

BNP believes that a caretaker role led by Dr. Muhammad Yunus, Chief Advisor of the Interim Government, is necessary to make the national election meaningful and participatory. BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir expressed this view during a press briefing after meeting the Chief Advisor at the State Guest House Jamuna on Tuesday (21 October) evening.

He said, “It is crucial to convey to the public that the administration will remain neutral before the elections. Without this assurance, public confidence cannot be established.”

Mirza Fakhrul further stated, “There are still many officials in the secretariat whom we consider supporters of the fascist government. We have requested the Chief Advisor to remove them and ensure an impartial administration.”

He added that if partisan individuals occupy various government positions, requests have been made to remove them as well.

Earlier, after 6 p.m., a three-member BNP delegation met with Chief Advisor Dr. Muhammad Yunus at the State Guest House Jamuna. Besides Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, the delegation included BNP Standing Committee members Amir Khasru Mahmud Chowdhury and Salahuddin Ahmed.
