



Most Reforms in Bangladesh Came Through BNP:Salahuddin Ahmed

Salahuddin Ahmed, a standing committee member of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), stated that the majority of reforms in Bangladesh's history have been initiated by the BNP. He made the comments on Monday evening at the BNP Chairperson's office in Gulshan during a reception for the National Citizen's Party (NCP), which was there to congratulate the BNP on its 47th founding anniversary.

Salahuddin Ahmed emphasized the importance of maintaining respectful dialogue among political parties, despite their differences. "This political culture will take the country a long way," he said. He added that re-establishing democratic culture is the only way to eliminate the "undemocratic trends" of the past decade. The senior BNP leader called for the preservation of the anti-fascist national unity, stating that a healthy political culture is necessary to end fascist politics.

NCP leaders at the event shared similar sentiments. Sarjis Alam, the chief organizer of NCP's northern region, claimed that former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina not only destroyed democracy but also the country's political culture. He stressed that a new Bangladesh cannot be built without cordial relations between political parties.

NCP leader Samanta Sharmin also weighed in on the legal complications surrounding the Dhaka University Central Students' Union (DUCSU) election. She said that no political party would tolerate attempts to use the Supreme Court to exert political influence.
