



3 Killed in Israeli Airstrikes on Lebanon

Israel has continued its attacks on Lebanon despite two rounds of ceasefire agreements and several international diplomatic efforts aimed at reducing tensions.

Since early Sunday (June 14), drone strikes and shelling in different parts of the country have left at least three people dead. According to reports, the victims included a mayor from the Rihan and Tyre regions.

Local sources said Israeli forces carried out intermittent attacks on several areas in southern Lebanon from the early hours of the day. The strikes damaged multiple buildings and resulted in casualties.

Meanwhile, Hezbollah claimed it had launched retaliatory operations in response to the attacks. In a statement, the group said it targeted two Israeli military positions with drones, adding that the strikes successfully hit their intended targets.

Israel has faced criticism for continuing military operations despite the ceasefire with Lebanon. Reports also suggest that fresh attacks were launched shortly after the announcement of the first ceasefire agreement.

Although halting attacks in Lebanon was reportedly discussed as part of a possible international understanding involving Iran, Tel Aviv has given no indication that it intends to comply. As a result, tensions and clashes continue on the ground despite repeated ceasefire announcements.
